Michael Sandel - Public Philosopher

Michael Sandel now has a remarkable reputation as a public philosopher, not just in the USA but across the globe. This evening will follow through on a *Mugge* discussion earlier this year, using Sandel's 'Philosophy bites' freely available on the web. Reference will also be made to last week's *In our Time* broadcast on Philosophy and Language.

- 1. Any who listened to Melvyn Bragg's radio programme last week (it can easily be down-loaded from BBC i-player facility) invited to comment on British 'ordinary language philosophy, 1930s to 1970s...'. This was not, in my view, one of the more enlightening IoT programmes views of others on this judgement also welcome.
- 2. Revisit the crucial word 'market' and engage with Sandel's question 'What should not be sold?'. Take his examples to tease out issues: Prostitution. Human kidneys. Paid for pregnancies in India...
- 3. In a similar way, consider 'outsourcing' or selling 'public services'.
- 4. Follow through on Sandel's answers to this question 'Should a banker be paid more than a nurse?'.
- 5. Take this phrase and follow, philosophically, the argument wherever it leads: 'Tough love'...

Using a lap-top or i-pad we may try to access Michael direct, talking about these big issues, listen to him for just a few minutes and discuss... (you can do this at home first, as preparation – just tap 'Michael Sandel' into your computer and follow the clicks to download, free-of-charge, his public lecture on markets ...). If, as is likely, modern technology lets us down again, we'll simply discuss the issues anyway.
